

LEADERSHIP EXPERIENCE THAT MATTERS

From 1991 to 2000, Mike Rounds served five terms in the South Dakota State Senate. In 1995, he was chosen by his peers to serve as Senate Majority Leader, a post he held for six years. Since South Dakota has a citizen legislature that meets for about two months each year, he continued to also work full-time in the private sector during this time as a legislator.

Two years after leaving the Senate, Rounds was elected to be the 31st Governor of South Dakota and took the oath of office in January 2003. He was re-elected by an overwhelming majority in 2006.

In January 2011, Mike returned to the private sector where he is one of the owners of Fischer, Rounds & Associates, Inc.

A FAMILY MAN AND BUSINESSMAN

Former South Dakota Governor Marion Michael "Mike" Rounds was born in Huron, South Dakota, on October 24, 1954. He was named after an uncle, Marion Rounds, who was killed in the Pacific theater during World War II.

The oldest of eleven children, he has spent his entire life in South Dakota. His dad, Don Rounds, is a Cavour native and still lives in the family home in Pierre with his wife, Rosemary. Mike's mom, Joyce (Reinartz), grew up in Huron. She died of breast cancer in 1987.

Mike played a lot of baseball while growing up in Pierre and also took part in track, cross country and Civil Air Patrol. He delivered newspapers and worked part-time at a local drive-in restaurant. He was able to pay for his own flying lessons and earned his pilot's license on his 17th birthday. He has continued to fly since that day and is a licensed commercial pilot with multi-engine and instrument ratings.

After graduating from Pierre Riggs High School, Mike went on to earn a bachelor's degree in political science from South Dakota State University.

Upon completing his college degree, Mike immediately entered the private sector, where he and his partners have spent over 30 years building a successful insurance and real estate business. What started as a small, 7-person office in Pierre has expanded to locations in Rapid City, Watertown, Mitchell, and Sioux Falls. The company now employs over 90 people.

Being immersed in the insurance and real estate industries for over 30 years has allowed Mike to stay on top of the wide variety of issues affecting South Dakotans on a daily basis.

The South Dakota outdoors have provided Mike and Jean with years of family time and enjoyment. They made camping on South Dakota lakes a priority for their family as their children were growing up and it is something they still do whenever possible.

Mike has been a hunter since that first pheasant hunt with his Dad as a youngster, and he now shares this activity with his extended family.

Mike was sworn in as South Dakota's 31st Governor on January 7, 2003, and was re-elected in 2006. After completing his second term in office, Mike returned to his insurance and real estate business. While Mike still enjoys hunting, camping, boating, racquetball and flying, spending time with six grandchildren has become a priority for him and Jean.



PROVEN RESULTS

During Governor Rounds' eight years in office, South Dakota's economy ranked top in the nation in a number of areas:

- #1 State Tax Business Climate Index (Tax Foundation)
- #1 Small Business Survival Index (Small Business & Entrepreneurship Council)
- #1 Business Tax Index: State Tax Systems for Entrepreneurship & Small Business (Small Business & Entrepreneurship Council)
- 2nd Lowest State Tax Rate Per Capita (lowest, if you don't smoke) in the nation (Tax Foundation)

During the same time period:

- Despite difficult times including a massive ice storm, drought, pine beetle infestations and a national recession - South Dakota's budget was balanced every year;
- South Dakota had the 3rd largest increase in per- capita personal income growth in the nation;
- There were over 28,000 more people with jobs in South Dakota from 2003-2010 despite the national recession;
- Construction of the Sanford Underground Laboratory at Homestake commenced and the first experiments at the 4,850-foot level of the mine were initiated;
- Substantial advancements in the ethanol and wind energy sectors were made;
- South Dakota had record enrollment at state universities and technical schools;
- Ten nationally competitive research centers were established; and
- Annual external funding for research was increased from \$54 million to \$154 million to provide our students with graduate work, keeping them in South Dakota.







AMERICA IS STRONG BUT WASHINGTON IS BROKEN

We must restore the principles that made America great - limited government, individual responsibility, less regulation and more freedom, so we can keep the American dream alive for our children and for future generations.
